8520 FREE AND REDUCED PRICE FOOD SERVICES

The Board of Education recognizes that the nutrition of <u>D</u>district students is an important factor in their educational progress. The Board therefore <u>shall</u>-participates in federally funded school lunch programs, and <u>shall</u>-provides free or reduced price <u>meal food</u> services to qualified <u>D</u>district students.

Availability, Application & Notification:

Notice of the availability of the free and reduced price meal programs will be sent to the homes of students, local media, the local unemployment office, and large employers experiencing layoffs in the area from which the <u>De</u>listrict draws its attendance. Any child who is a member of a family unit whose income is below the federally established scale <u>shall be_is</u> eligible to receive such services. Notification procedures for availability and eligibility will not overtly identify a student or family as eligible for free or reduced price <u>meals</u>.

To apply for the free or reduced price meal program:

a. Application forms will be available in the main office of each school building and on the <u>D</u>district's website and can be completed and submitted at any time during the year.

b. Completed forms must be submitted to the Building Principal of the school which the student attends prior to any determination of eligibility.

c. The parent or guardian will be informed of the Building Principal determination within one week of receiving a properly completed application.

Applications will be kept confidential.

Upon written request, the Business Official will hear appeals of determinations regarding such services in compliance with federal regulations governing the National School Lunch Program.

In addition, in order to reach students who are <u>categorically</u> eligible for free and reduced price meals and to comply with state law, three times per school year the <u>B</u>business <u>O</u>efficial will review the list made available by the State Education Department of children ages three to 18 who are in households receiving federal food assistance. <u>Medicaid benefits (for certain recipients)</u>, or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) to identify students within the <u>D</u>district. The <u>D</u>district will send a notice to those families apprising them of their student's eligibility to participate in the school meal programs without further application. <u>Notification procedures for availability and eligibility will not overtly identify a student or family as eligible for free or reduced price meals</u>. Parents/<u>Guardians</u> may decline participation by informing the <u>D</u>district in writing. If the service is declined, the student will be removed from the eligibility list.

The Building Principal in conjunction with <u>the</u> Business Official will establish meal time procedures that both protect the anonymity of the student and allow for proper accounting.
