## Superintendent's Notebook Eric Lutinski, Ed.D.

Dear Rye Neck families,

We have some exciting things to share as we wish the Rye Neck Community a prospective Happy New Year.

I thank the various volunteers who helped get our strategic planning process started. Members of our Board of Education, parent and community members, students, teachers, and



administrators spent two days with our consultant, Judy Wilson. This critical initial work on mission and goals was student-centered, but also focused on our community, faculty and staff. Internal work will now turn to developing the action steps necessary to achieve each of the proposed goals. Our upcoming budget development will take our strategic planning, as well as the survey feedback we received from our community, into consideration, allowing the action steps to begin at the end of this school year and take us through the end of 2025.

A significant aspect of the strategic planning work was to define our vision of a Rye Neck learner. Our students, as well as the adults in our organization, should appreciate and value the "journey" in addition to reaching the "destination." In other words, Rye Neck Panthers of all types will not only be goal-oriented, but should be engaged in the learning process at all stages for knowledge and growth. As they develop critical thinking and collaborative skills, they should be curious, flexible, and have an awareness of the people they work with and environments they work in. Our learners will act with both head and heart.

Complimenting long-range plans to refresh our district mission, our two advisory groups have also engaged in important work. The Facilities Planning Advisory Team has been analyzing the Building Condition Survey prepared by our architect to prioritize maintenance and long-term projects. A key element of this process is a walkthrough of each building on our three campuses to inform eventual recommendations to the Board of Education. The goal is a schedule for project work and a five-year capital project plan for potential bond referendums, as well as use of the

While our students and teachers are hard at work wrapping up their studies before the holidays, the district is hard at work on our strategic plan. In late November,



twenty-seven members of the Rye Neck community met for two full days to align on plans for our children's future, engaging in conversation, data analysis, and goal setting. We started by recognizing our many strengths as a district, including our tight-knit community, small class sizes, caring teachers and staff, and exceptional students and families. Then, we reviewed the results of parent surveys, staff surveys, student surveys and stakeholder interviews. We took stock of what our community values most so we can map out plans for Rye Neck's future that prioritize the evolving needs and desires of our students. We feel energized about the next steps we will take together as a school district and look forward to sharing the details of the plan in the coming weeks.

The Board of Education has also been focusing on improving communication with the community. In the interest of keeping families informed and aware of our work, we've begun recording our monthly planning sessions, which can be found, along with recordings of our monthly Board meetings, on the district website. We are making a concerted effort to provide information to the public in advance of our meetings, emailing direct links to our agendas and attachments on Board Docs. Monthly Superintendent's reports and president's reports can also be accessed on our website. As always, we welcome community feedback and participation.

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2022 Capital Reserve Fund.

The Technology Planning Advisory Team will delve into our infrastructure, including security technology, and the general buying cycle for maintenance and upgrades. Although much groundwork had been done in 2021 when the district underwent a major transition from its last-generation website, the team's first order of business has been to explore changes to our website brought on by the acquisition of our previous vendor by a new company. To prepare for a new "face of the district" for the 2024-25 school year, the team conducted a survey to gather feedback from the community.

Early data from that survey indicates the community prefers information via email as opposed to the Rye Neck app or by visiting the website, although many were not aware of our app and would like to use it more; the top reasons people visit our website is for the calendars, for staff contact information, and for food service information; and most suggestions for the improvement of our website have to do with user-friendliness and simplicity. The survey also asked about social media preferences. This effort to make changes to our district communications coincides with our efforts to expand opportunities to access Board of Education material and meetings.

I wish you a joyful holiday season with family and friends and I look forward to a rewarding 2024.


## Latest News from the Rye Neck Athletic Department
