

for their first step into the future.





Chelsea Wang Class of 2023 Valedictorian

Senior Chelsea Wang is the Class of 2023 Valedictorian, but she's not one to tout her accomplishments and doesn't like being in the spotlight. In fact, she never officially announced where she's going to college next year because she doesn't agree with the emphasis placed on that decision. Instead, she thinks people should focus more on the best option for themselves and less on if they'll be judged for their choice. She says, "people can get a fantastic education no matter where they go."

The self-proclaimed perfectionist thinks it's incredibly important to be well-read and "doesn't think she'd be Valedictorian without that, even if the books she read didn't relate to what she was learning in class." As an introvert, she used books to help her interpret other people and understand the different realities we experience. Her strong opinions on social issues are both created and challenged by the books she reads.

One of the topics she's passionate about is amatonormativity: a concept coined by Rice University professor Dr. Elizabeth Brake. Amatonormativity "is the widespread assumption that everyone is better off in an exclusive, romantic, long-term coupled relationship, and that everyone is seeking such a relationship." Chelsea says "love without being understood is empty." People can't control their romantic attractions and to place "so much emphasis on something you don't control feels really damaging to her." She's interested in how different our society would be if amatonormativity wasn't so embedded. She wonders "how do people act differently when there is a romantic attraction or validation at stake and is this difference authentic to ourselves?"

Instead, she thinks platonic relationships should be prioritized more. She says friendship is a very beautiful thing, but acknowledges that it's not given the same value as romantic relationships. She finds it strange that someone might have no problem asking a partner to move across the country with them, but asking a friend to do the same isn't considered socially acceptable because friendship isn't seen as important as familial or romantic relationships. She says, "the expectations of friendships are much lower than those two because of the way our laws and society are structured." As an avid reader, she likes to read books with powerful friendships at the core because she's drawn to that connection, but she says it's rare to find stories that center on friendships as opposed to romantic relationships.

Chelsea likes to do her own thing and despises the societal "norms" and pressure placed on people, especially in high school. Admittedly, she has negative impressions of people. Because of Rye Neck's size, she says people are seen in their entirety, which can be good and bad. Her emphasis on friendships comes from watching people settle for convenient relationships rather than valuing their sense of self. Her advice to those who might think like she does: "there are people out there who will like you for you, don't settle for less."

Nathaniel Findlay Class of 2023 Salutatorian

Senior Nathaniel Findlay is the Salutatorian for the Class of 2023: an achievement he is honored to have earned because he is constantly in awe of how intelligent and dedicated his entire grade is.

While Salutatorian wasn't necessarily a goal for him, he sets incredibly high expectations for himself and feels an internal pressure to do well. He knew his grades were strong and he was confident in his ability, but he didn't know for sure where he stood compared to his peers; so the announcement was a little bit of a surprise. He admits senioritis (the common phenomenon where many seniors tend to "check out" once they've submitted their college applications) hit in mid-January; but the lack of stress not only helped him continue to do well in his classes, he really got a chance to enjoy the end of his senior year.

Nathaniel's transcript includes 8 AP classes, 5 of which he took senior year. However, his favorites were classes



like Bioethics and Social Inequalities in the United States, which challenged him to think beyond the obvious solutions and explore perspectives that had no real right answer. It was about learning to see the merit in both sides of an argument. Nathaniel says he's always been better at justifying his thoughts than selecting multiple choice answers, so classes revolving around student voice and discussions honed in on those skills and led to an interest in psychology, which directed his college search.

In recent months, Nathaniel has garnered several accolades for his performance as Dmitry in "Anastasia," including winning the Metro Award for Outstanding Performance in a Leading Male Role; a nomination for Outstanding Duet at the Metro Awards with Lulu Tagger; and a nomination in the 2023 Roger Rees Awards. He also was awarded Best in Fest at the NY Thespian Festival, and a Superior Rating in both Solo and Duet Musical Theatre at the NY Thespys. Despite all of this, he didn't apply to colleges for theater.

At the time his applications were due, he was more interested in studying psychology and law. He's passionate about the relationship between politics and mental health, which he says needs to be addressed more in society. He's frustrated by the idea that "people can't just exist...if someone has a problem in their life, it's always criticized by someone who's not experiencing that problem and, therefore, can't see it from that point of view." To combat the issue, he's founded projects that use his passion, music, to raise awareness and money for disadvantaged LGBTQ+ teens in the city who don't have a similar socioeconomic environment as Westchester County. All of this led him to commit to Georgetown University.

He imagined continuing theater as an extra-curricular, but now he's "kind of at a crossroads." Music and theater is "what he wants to do, and can't imagine just stopping." As of right now, he is looking at pursuing a double major in theater and psychology, but is open to putting his name out there. Nathaniel is excited to just "see what happens" and explore this fall, because if something isn't the right environment, he'll be able to search and find it somewhere else.

Previously a fierce competitive swimmer, his first stint with acting was in 8th grade when he played the Tin Man in Rye Neck Middle School's production of "The Wizard of Oz." When the pandemic hit a year later and his swim team was forced to stop, he joined productions at Artistree Performing Arts in Mamaroneck and he's been doing at least 2 shows at a time ever since (he's done 6 this year). While his schedule is hectic between rehearsals, homework, and going out with friends, he says it is "absolutely worth it." For Nathaniel, "acting is about constantly learning and playing," and he is always able to find something new to enjoy each day. He admits there is still so much left for him to learn and is excited to expand his horizons directing a short film this summer and hopefully producing productions in Georgetown.

Though unsure of what the future holds, Nathaniel is ready to make it his own and is excited to see who and what the future holds.




