I. Opening of Meeting

President Golle called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

Approval of Minutes of November 16, 2022 Board of Education Meeting

III. Discussion

Stress Busters - Mental Wellness Discussion

Dr. Lutinski and Mr. Siegel discussed with the Board the content of the November 3rd presentation, *Stress Busters: Flexibility in the Learning Environment*, given by Professor Cathy Vatterott from the University of Missouri-St. Louis which some of the administrators and board members participated in. The goal of her presentation was to understand the problem, see what other schools are doing and examine our practices. She discussed the social pressures that affect students and explained how school can either add to or mitigate these pressures. Based on a survey given to high school students, the top stressors are grades, tests and other assessments, overall workload and homework and lack of sleep. Dr. Lutinski stated that these are topics which Rye Neck has been addressing for many years.

Discussion was had regarding the rise in the number of children in crisis. In addition, discussion was had regarding the issues involved in changing school times, the rationale for tests and quizzes, the use of a testing calendar, and changes that can be made. Mr. Siegel stated that the social/emotional piece is most important and students need to be taught coping strategies. However, adults need to have the skills first.

Students with Interrupted Formal Education (SIFE)

Mrs. Ryan reviewed the background on the Commissioner’s regulations on educating SIFE students. The district currently has 4 SIFE students. She stated that the students are assessed by the ENL teachers when they enter the district and again at the end of each school year. Discussion was had regarding meeting their needs, the need to build a capacity to educate them, and the district’s staffing needs.

Senior and Disability Tax Exemption Cap and Increase

Mrs. Mahar discussed with the Board the senior tax exemption and disabled tax exemption income cap and increase. She reported that New York State and Westchester County recently passed amendments to increase the income limits for low income seniors and persons with disabilities as they relate to tax exemptions. Local governments and school districts can opt to grant a reduction of up to 50% on the amount of property taxes paid by qualifying seniors and those with disabilities. Rye Town and Rye City have opted to increase the limits. Mrs. Mahar reviewed the district’s income limit and estimated impacts of increasing the limit to the new maximums. The board can decide to make no change or increase the limit to the maximum amount or to another amount.

It was decided to discuss this further at the January 4th planning session. If a change is made, it needs to be adopted by the board prior to May 1, 2023, and will impact the 2024-25 school tax year.

IV. Executive Session
