Superintendent's Remarks

Thank you President Mansell, and good evening.

The week before Homecoming is always busy and that was true this year as students in all four schools enjoyed spirit activities. One of my favorites is Buddy Day, part of Senior Week, which pairs 6th graders with 12th graders. At Daniel Warren and FE Bellows, student athletes visited to include our younger students in the excitement, and blues skies helped give us an energetic pep rally for the MS/HS on Friday afternoon.

We had outstanding community turnout last weekend, regardless of the soggy weather on Saturday. The Booster Club did a tremendous job of creating spirit and a festive environment for teams, athletes and coaches. And, significantly, our Homecoming teams were undefeated.

This week is Digital Citizenship Week. Ensuring our students are well equipped with the necessary tools to navigate the digital landscape is increasingly important. Just as good citizens contribute positively to their communities, digital citizens should contribute positively to online communities. These skills are vital for educators, students, parents, and all internet users. In our schools this week, students are participating in lessons built around digital citizenship, such as online responsibility, the power of words, the importance of media balance, and the impact of artificial intelligence. Within the last two weeks we have sent information and applications for two opportunities for community participation in part of our processes.

The Technology Planning Advisory Team will similarly help with a review of the new website template and enhanced Rye Neck app, help with prioritization of our equipment buying cycle, help recommendations on technology infrastructure upgrades, and review technology security enhancements.
