### **Snow Day Calendar Update**

Please note that there will be **no school on Monday, April 18th and Friday May 27th** as per our [Rye Neck 2021-22 District Calendar](#). Rye Neck has only used one "snow day", so there will be no school on the unused make-up days.

New York State is allowing schools to conduct remote instruction on days when weather or some other event closes the buildings. This enables us to count a day as a "school day" instead of having to make the day up later in the year. "Make-up" days are predesignated when the annual calendar is created. This year, our make-up days were May 31st, April 18th, and May 27th (in order of use).

Rye Neck schools were closed with remote learning on January 5th (the surprise ice storm) and February 4th (the ice storm that didn't happen), and had a traditional snow day on January 7th. September 2nd (Ida) was a declared emergency and did not count against us. Therefore, we will be in school on May 31st since we only need to make up one day.

On a related note, the Board of Education will be voting on the approval of our 2022-23 district calendar at their April 20th meeting. We are frequently asked if students will begin school before or after Labor Day: the proposed calendar has staff coming in the week before, but students coming in the week after.

Right now we are looking forward to Spring Break, our final chance for extended rest before the final quarter of the school year. Enjoy!
