Dear Rye Neck Families,

What is the Capital Proposal in Proposition II?

Later this month, on Tuesday, May 21st, in the MS/HS Community Room, our community has the opportunity to vote on *three* different items rather than the usual two. In addition to the 2024-25 district operating budget (Proposition I) and Board of Education trustee vote, the community will have the opportunity to vote on



"Proposition II" to determine whether we can use our Capital Reserve Fund to address building and campus improvements.

What is Proposition II? At our September Board of Education meeting LAN Associates, our district architects, presented their findings after our 2022 Building Condition Survey, an assessment required of all districts by NY State. LAN pointed out certain elements of the building condition survey and identified them in order of priority. To address maintenance, safety, and present and future improvements to our campus facilities we are presenting our community with an opportunity for input. Proposition II makes use of \$2.7 million in the Capital Reserve Fund voters approved in 2022. These are items included in Proposition II:

- Maintenance and repair of masonry, new pavement, and fencing replacement at both Daniel
 Warren and F.E. Bellows. These buildings are a century old and require this maintenance work.
 The envelope work will ensure protection of the elementary schools against weather elements
 such as rain, wind, snow, and extreme temperatures, while new pavement and fencing will
 enhance the safety of both of these sites.
- Replace the lower roof and skylights at the high school gymnasium, specifically the section
 over the Fitness Center. This was the only section not included in the previous roof project
 and will complete the improvements of roofs across the district.
- An assessment of the infrastructure of Daniel Warren and F.E. Bellows for HVAC improvements. Neither has the electrical capacity, for example, for us to air condition classrooms. Proposition II would determine the scope of work necessary to make changes to both elementary schools.

- A study to evaluate the potential redesign of our MS/HS athletic fields. Although many think first about turf vs. grass, this study would encompass the entire outdoor facilities design and field positions as a whole to make the most effective use of our acreage.
- An exploration of a possible district-wide energy performance contract. The US Department of Energy has a succinct definition of what this means: "Energy Savings Performance Contracting is a budget-neutral approach to make building improvements that reduce energy and water use and increase operational efficiency. By partnering with an energy service company, a facility owner can use an ESPC to pay for today's facility upgrades with tomorrow's energy savings without tapping into capital budgets."

Why is the Proposition II vote separate from the budget vote? We are not asking our community for any money and this does not affect our proposed 2024-25 operating budget. Proposition II makes use of the Capital Reserve Fund approved by our voters in 2022 specifically for these types of projects. Although use of the Capital Reserve Fund does not require any further levying of taxes, voter authorization is required to use the fund for project work.

Rye Neck Strategic Plan

Last month I mentioned the trilogy written by Kobi Yamada and illustrated by Mae Besom, starting with *What Do You Do With An Idea?* Our Strategic Planner, Judy Wilson had recommended the books based on our goals. Although they are "children's books", I enjoy reading anything from Beatrix Potter to Harry Potter. The significance, of course, is the author's ability to boil a point down to an easily understandable language. *What Do You Do With A Problem?* is the second book.

The inspirational messages in this book can be encapsulated in a few quotes: "The more I worried, the bigger my problem became" until I "tackled my problem" and found that "my problem wasn't what I thought it was". Ultimately, "my problem held an opportunity". Fear of the unknown, or fear of things we don't understand lead us to perseveration on the small and an inability to think big. As Rye Neck prepares for the July 1 enactment of our Strategic Plan Goals throughout the spring, particularly in a season where graduate speeches often mention challenges, we will be encouraging our students, staff, and community to look toward the opportunity hidden within each challenge.

NY State 3-8 Math Assessments

Our grades 3 through 8 New York State English Mathematics assessments are occurring this week. All testing is done during the first two or three periods of the day in both buildings and the tests are untimed: as long as students are productively working, they may keep working. Beginning this spring, grades 5-8 assessments will be computer-based while we are still using traditional paper and pencil tests for grade 3 and 4.

These assessments gauge how well districts do as a whole regarding instruction on NY State standards and assist in directing measures to improve students' mastery of the standards. The data received from the state assessments is analyzed to meet students' needs and inform instruction to improve their skills. While students are not penalized for not taking the tests, Rye Neck is. Any district that does not meet the minimum 95% participation rate for each grade level

and test will have a negative rating on the New York State accountability reports in the *participation* category. Additionally, non-tested students negatively affect Rye Neck's *proficiency* category on the New York State accountability reports.

Student Spotlight

In each monthly message, we spotlight high school students who are doing interesting things in or out of school.
